PRAISING YOUR RIDERS: The proper use of praise can be a very effective strategy to encourage children to make positive choices while on your bus. When praising, always be sincere. Children always know when adults don't mean what they say. Be specific by telling your riders exactly what they are doing that shows cooperation, so they are more likely to engage in that same behavior again. Saying statements such as a "Good job" does not tell your riders exactly what they are doing that you approve of. However, if you say, "You stayed calm even when the bus was noisy" it tells them exactly what they did that showed they were a team player.
