LOST CELL PHONES: When a cell phone is left on our public transit buses our Transit Department does its best to find the rightful owner. Unclaimed cell phones are donated to a cell phone bank located in Florida. These phones are cleaned, refurbished, and donated to police departments across the country. We were able to donate 35 phones in the October through December 2022 time period. Of the 35 phones we donated, 71% were repurposed and 29% were

unusable and recycled responsibly. How do our donations help victims in need:
